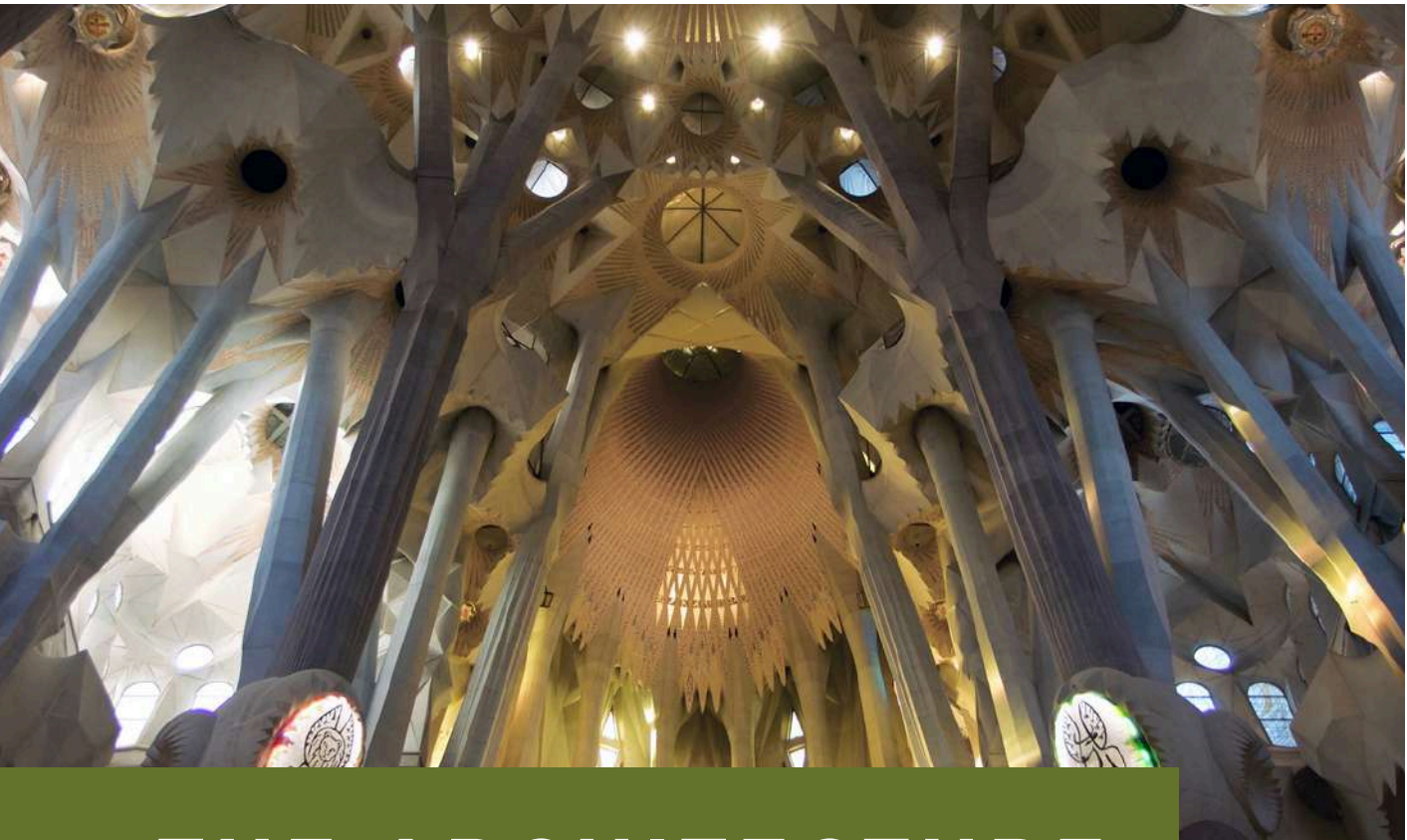

THE ARCHITECTURE EXPERIENCE

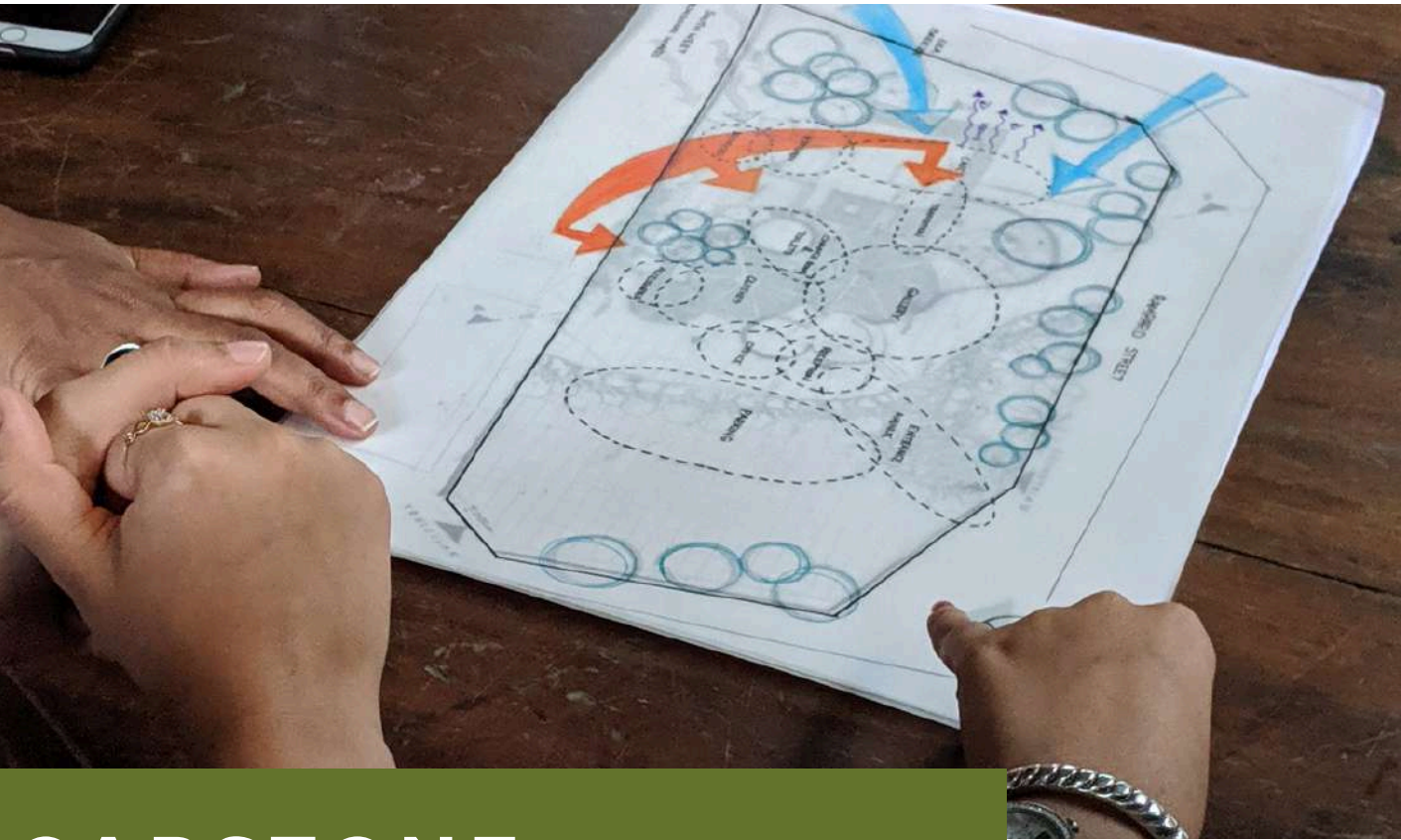
The best approach to growing as an architect is to learn from experiencing and observing. The *Architecture Experience* aims to do just that. Participants get to observe contextual architecture through site visits and interactions, and document the learning in a themed narrative for later referencing.

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**15 DAYS,

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These visits will focus on observing and learning about the importance of contextualising architecture, the history of different architectural styles and techniques, importance of design, its influence on architecture around the world, sustainability and other aspects which draw scores of visitors to European architecture. The visits will foster a deep understanding of city planning, old architecture and its conversion to new, mobility driven infrastructure, while working on a documentation project across different themes.



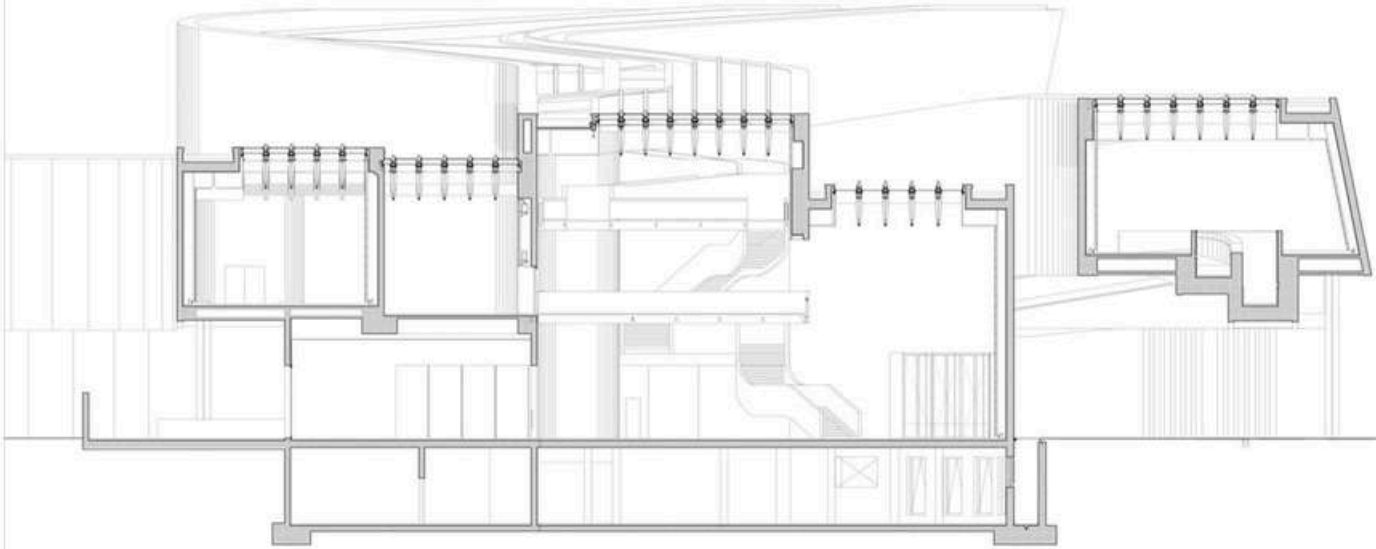
Project work by the October 2019 batch - A pop up pavilion design

CAPSTONE PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Architecture Experience is designed with the intent of enhancing architectural understanding. To this end, a short project is included as part of the experience. The idea of the project is to refine an existing project with the ideologies of integrating traditional methodology in contemporary architecture.

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This project will include a pre-tour assignment. Participants will be given an existing project in which they will have to conduct a basic SWOT analysis and identify areas that could be enhanced by ideologies of how to contextualise architecture. When on the tour, participants will review their on-site notes and observations and highlight important aspects that could be relevant to adapting and improving their own projects. At the end of the tour, participants will prepare and present a conceptual revision of the projects which will then be discussed and reviewed by the curator. The discussion will cover the feasibility and impact of their design modifications and how to proceed post-trip.

WHAT IS IN IT FOR ME?

Participants get to understand the influence of history, art and design in architecture across different periods, and observe how sites are adapted for today's use. Participants also get to understand how sustainability is approached in the projects visited, and the solutions devised.

From a learning perspective, participants get to understand how their domain of interest approaches sustainability in the urban context, and how they can work towards Sustainable Development Goals in their projects.

At the end of the Experience, participants will have an improved practical understanding of what they study in college and learn how to implement these strategies into their own projects, enhancing their portfolios.

Participants also get internship opportunities from our partners, and the more innovative their design proposal is, the better the chances of getting the internship.

Topic of Discussion: Haussmann Architecture and its influence on modern-day Paris.

Places to visit: Les Docks: City of Fashion and Design, Centre George Pompidou, Fondation Louis Vuitton, Philharmonie De Paris (outside visit).

Cultural Visit: Palais Garnier, Place De La Concorde, Arc De Triomphe, Basilique Du Sacre-Coeur de Montmartre.

DAY 4

Morning Arrival in Lille.

Topic of Discussion: French Renaissance revival architecture and its influence on the global architectural movement.

Places to visit: Notre Dame de la Treille, Stock Exchange building (outside visit), Chambre De Commerce, Citadelle de Lille.

Cultural visit: Old Town.

DAY 5

Topic of Discussion: The rise of contemporary modernism in a classical background.

Places to visit: Museum of Modern Art, Villa Cavrois, Euralille Youth Center.

DAY 6

Arrival in Barcelona.

Topic of Discussion: Historic evolution of Catalan and Spanish architecture.

Places to visit: Barcelona Cathedral and Gothic Quarter, MACBA, Casa Mila, Casa Batllo.

Cultural visit: Parc Guell, Portal De L'angel, Carrer D'Avinyo.

DAY 7

Topic of Discussion: Urban planning, Barcelona city grid and the concept of superblocks.

Places to visit: Sagrada Familia, Agbar Tower & Design Museum of Barcelona (outside visit), Bunkers del Carmel.

Topic of Discussion: Romanesque architecture due to the rise of monasticism and the blend of Renaissance, baroque and neoclassical architecture.

Cultural visit: Apostolic Palace, Pauline Chapel.

Topic of Discussion: Contemporary architecture and the global context

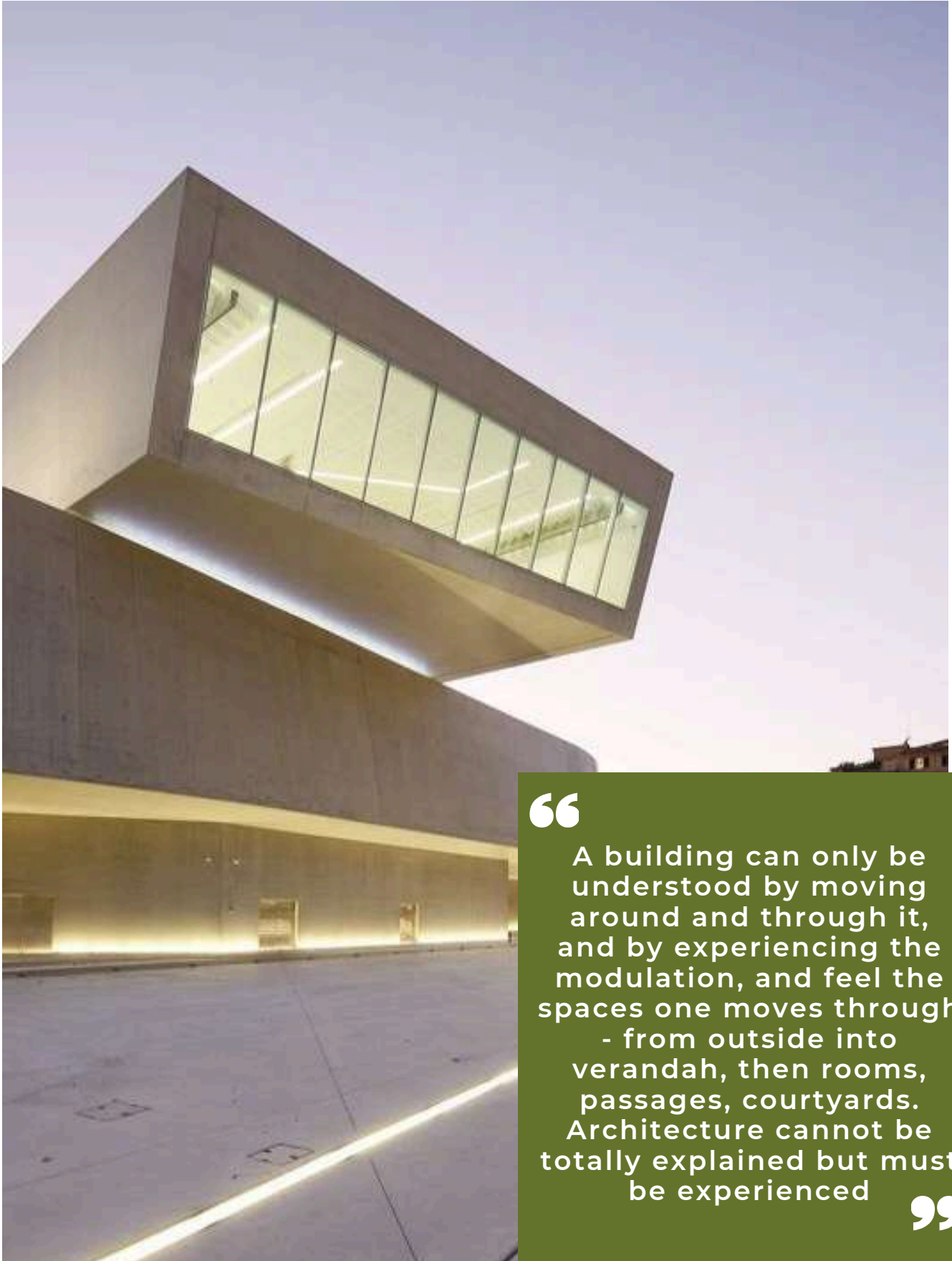
